Kitti Gosztola, nominee of the prestigious Essl Art Award, is the first artist to exhibit her *Labours of the Months* cycle at Innotica Group's Budapest offices.

She often questions the common meaning of different phenomena, places them into new contexts, showing new, innovative ways of understanding them. Her recent series reflect this artistic attitude of her, e.g. Folk Intimacy, Labours of the Months, Right Tree Right Place. The technical background of her work is always in-line with her thoughts, emotions, critical approach, and sense of humor.
